Burnaby, B.C. (November 22, 2021) The Diane Harwood Foundation recently presented The Salvation Army with a generous cheque for \$1 million to support women struggling with addiction. The transformational gift will help fund the Diane Harwood Addiction Treatment Program, which will be a part of the new Vancouver Harbour Light facility on the Downtown Eastside. The building is slated to start construction in spring of 2022 and the program will fill a much-needed gap that currently exists for women who battle addiction and substance abuse.
